“This set is fantastic and includes the best graphics I have ever seen. Each volume has an average of 1,000 illustrations. There is a two-page introduction to the theme, and topics are arranged into sections. The illustrations are vibrant, and include drawings, photographs, and graphs. Textual information surrounds the labeled pictures. Cycle illustrations, whether in life or production, display the steps from beginning to finish. These volumes are tied to science standards and curriculum. The books will pull in visual learners. Each volume includes a glossary and an index. Cross indexing between volumes would have made it even better. Whether students need a diagram of the parts of a lobster’s body, drawings of mammals from 200 millions years ago, or to see how oil is extracted from the ground and processed, this is the set that students will use for browsing, reporting, or studying the structure of the totally unique nonfiction.”
